Critical part of the workforce system

- Vocational rehabilitation (VR) agencies help people with disabilities maximize their employment and independence
 - This year marks the 100th anniversary of the VR program
- Federal-state (and territories) partnership
 - Overseen nationally by the Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA), in the U.S. Department of Education
 - Administered by states and territory level by 78 agencies
 - In 2018, served nearly 900,000 consumers and 137,000 students with disabilities
- VR can be especially helpful to people with disabilities this year



Each agency operates in its unique landscape

- Education and skills of consumers
- Mix of industries, occupations, and employers
- Environment
 - State Medicaid policies
 - State and local education
 - Other community-based organizations
 - Political and fiscal contexts
- Attitudes, expectations, and culture related to disability, employment, and integration



Facing common challenges

- Mandates in the 2014 Workforce Innovation and Opportunities Act
 - Emphasis on competitive, integrated, employment
 - Expand services to students including those that have not yet applied for VR services
 - New reporting requirements
- Pandemic-induced challenges



What can we learn from one another?

What works in addressing pandemic challenges including

- Outreach and completing applications
- Providing pre-employment transition services
- Health and safety of staff and consumers
- Connecting with employers
- Coordinating across local agencies
